What is the DITA-OT?

- **An open source project, licensed under Apache 2.0**
- **A collection of Ant, Java, and XSLT scripts that transform DITA to:**
 - HTML
 - HTML with a JavaScript frameset
 - JavaHelp
 - Microsoft Help
 - Eclipse Help
 - PDF
 - Open Document Type (ODT)
 - Docbook
 - PDF
 - Eclipse content



How the DITA-OT project operates

- **Monthly meetings of volunteers**
 - Usually one Tuesday a month at 10-11 AM ET
 - Contact Robert Anderson if you want an invitation
- **3-4 committers**
- **Source code and packages hosted at GitHub**
- **Follows a process of iterative milestone releases, culminating in the release of the “stable” version**

(Ancient) history of the DITA-OT

- **Developed together at IBM**
- **When donated to the world:**
 - DITA went to OASIS
 - Code was refactored, and the DITA-OT was born at SourceForge



Timeline of significant events

Date	Event
2001	DITA package first posted on DeveloperWorks. It includes both DTDs and XSLT.
Fall 2004	dita-users list started on Yahoo!
14 March 2005	DITA-OT 1.0 released on SourceForge. Includes full support for DITA 1.0. First (and last?) time that version numbers are in sync. OASIS releases DITA 1.0 in August 2005.
29 Sep 2006	DITA-OT version 1.3 released, with early support for DITA 1.1. OASIS releases DITA 1.1 in August 2007.
30 April 2008	DITA-OT 1.4.2 released, now contains “full-easy-install” packages.
18 March 2009	DITA-OT 1.4.3 released, contains current PDF transformation (PDF2). Previously available as a plug-in made available by Idiom.

Timeline of significant events (cont.)

Date	Event
6 Jan 2009	DITA-OT 1.5 released, with support for DITA 1.2. OASIS releases DITA 1.2 in December 2010.
Early 2011	Jarno gets involved. (Everyone cheers.)
27 June 2012	DITA-OT 1.6 released: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Performance enhancements• Deprecated code removed• Error messages reworked; doc improvements• Current release numbering starts
April 2013	DITA-OT 1.7 released: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Transformation style sheets begin to move to individual plug-ins• XHTML flagging logic refactored
Sept 2014	DITA-OT 1.8.5 released
Nov 2014	DITA-OT day in Munich, Germany

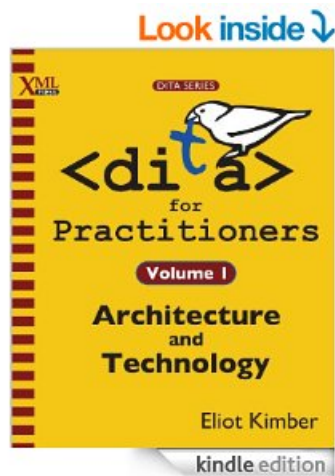

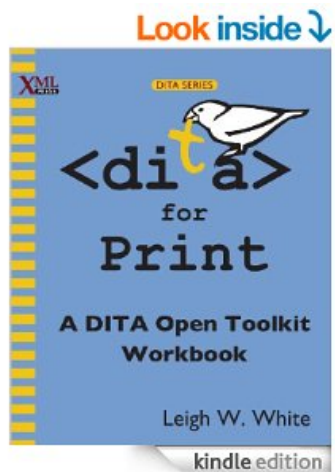
